A PROCLAMATION.
For a Bank Holiday.

VICTORIA, R.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday the twenty-second day of June next should be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," appoint Tuesday the twenty-second day of June next as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, and every part thereof, and We do by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twenty-sixth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred hundred and ninety-seven, and in the sixtieth year of Our Reign.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS,
1878 to 1895.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," that on the 27th March 1897 he made an Order under section 39 of "The Factory and Workshop Act, 1895," directing that in certain factories and workshops different branches or departments of work may, so far as regards the employment of women during overtime, be treated as different factories or workshops.
