Regulation 16 will henceforth be as follows:—

16. In any year in which an Open Competition for situations as Assistant Clerk (Abstractor Class) in the Civil Service or for Clerkships of the Second Division is held, a Boy Copyist (New Class) who obtains from the Head of the Department in which he is serving leave of absence to attend such Examination, may also, at the discretion of the Head of the Department, be allowed pay, at the usual rate, for the days during which he is attending the Examination.
