WILD BIRDS PROTECTION ACTS,  
1880 to 1896.

COUNTY OF ARGYLL.

ISLANDS OF ISLAY, COLONSAY, COLL, AND  
TIREE.

ORDER by the Secretary for Scotland.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the County of Argyll, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. The taking or destroying the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited in the Islands of Islay, Colonsay, Coll, and Tiree during the currency of this Order, viz.:—

Common Wild Duck (*Anas boscas*).  
Teal (*Querquedula crecca*).  
Eider Duck (*Somateria mollissima*).  
Merganser (*Mergus serrator*).  
Snipe (*Gallinago celestis*).  
Dunlin (*Tringa alpina*).  
Grebe (*Podiceps minor*).

Lapwing (*Manellus vulgaris*).

Tern—all kinds (*Sterna fluviatilis*, *Sterna macrura*, *Sterna minuta*).

Richardson's Skua (*Stercorarius crepidatus*).

Pochard (*Fuligula ferina*).

Tufted Duck (*Fuligula cristata*).

Chough (*Pyrrhocorax graculus*).

2. The "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the Islands of Islay, Colonsay, Coll, and Tiree during the currency of this Order to the

Tufted Duck (*Fuligula cristata*),

as if that species had been included in the Schedule to the said Act.

3. This Order shall take effect on the 14th day of March 1898, and shall remain in force until the thirty-first day of December 1898.
