TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 25th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vict. cap. 2, and 52 Vict. cap. 6, to the amount of £1,500,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 2nd March.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 2nd March 1898, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months, after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz., on the 2nd June, or 2nd September next, or 2nd March 1899 respectively.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
