The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896, and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
