PARCEL POST.

GREECE.

IN pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 10th day of July 1899, has been made on his representation by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Post Office Acts, ordering, directing, and declaring that, on and from the 1st day of August 1899, parcels may, subject to the provisions of the said Warrant, and at the rates of postage therein specified, and in accordance with the Regulations therein referred to, be transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and Greece.

And the Postmaster-General further gives notice that copies of the said Warrant may be purchased, either directly or through any bookseller, from Eyre & Spottiswoode, East Harding Street, Fleet Street, E.C.; or John Menzies & Co., 12 Hanover Street, Edinburgh, and 90 West Nile Street, Glasgow; or Hodges, Figgis, & Co. Limited, 104 Grafton Street, Dublin.

STAMP DUTIES.

Whereas section 12 (2) of the Finance Act, 1899, provides, *inter alia*, that Her Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue may add to the Schedule to that Act a rate of exchange for any Foreign or Colonial currency not mentioned

therein, and that such Act shall be construed as if any rate of exchange for the time being added were contained in the said schedule, the said Commissioners do hereby give notice that they have fixed the rate of exchange for the paper dollar (peso) of the Argentine Republic at 2s.

CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination of Candidates for registration as Boy Copyists (New Class) will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Bristol, Liverpool, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Belfast, and Cork, on the 18th October 1899, under the Regulations dated the 2nd May 1899, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.
