TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Tuesday the 2nd proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vict. cap. 2, 52 Vict. cap. 6, and 63 Vict. cap. 2, to the amount of £3,000,000, for the replacement of £2,000,000 falling due on the 6th proximo, and the issue of £1,000,000 under the Treasury Bills Act, 1899.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 6th January 1900, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months, after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz., on the 6th April 1900, or 6th July 1900, or 6th January 1901 respectively.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday the 3rd proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than one o'clock on Saturday the 6th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
