The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Thomas Macleod, Esq., Director of the Maritime Company of Manila, Her Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of a Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Order of Isabella the Catholic, conferred upon him by Her Majesty the Queen Regent of Spain, in the name of His Majesty the King of Spain, in recognition of his services in assisting the wounded and sick of the Spanish Army in the last Campaign in the Philippines.
