### STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS, 1960. ANATOMY.

The Anatomy (Certificates of Interment) (Scotland) Order, 1900, dated fourteenth June 1900.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Anatomy Act, 1871 (34 and 35 Vict. cap. 16), and by the Secretary for Scotland Acts, 1885 to 1889, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Anatomy (Certificates of Interment) (Scotland) Order, 1900.
- 2. The period limited by section 13 of the Anatomy Act, 1832 (2 and 3 William IV., cap. 75), as the time within which the Certificate of Interment of any body which has been subjected to Anatomical Examination shall be transmitted to the Inspector of the District shall, so far as Reverend Daniel Rechab Vaughan, M.A.

relates to Scotland, be extended to such period, not exceeding twelve months, as the Inspector of Anatomy for Scotland may from time to time, or in any case, require.

3. The Order of the Secretary for Scotland of 23rd May 1890 is hereby revoked.
