This day the Lords being met, and the Commons attending, the Royal Affent, by commission, was given to an act for raising a further sum of two millions by Exchequer bills, for the service of the year 1804. An act for granting to his Majesty a duty upon malt made in Ireland for the year 1804. An act fer charging, until the 25th day of March 1805, certain rates and duties, and for allowing certain bounties and drawbacks upon goods, wares, and merchandise imported into and exported from Ireland; and also for charging certain inland duties of Excise, and taxes in Ireland in lieu of some rates, duties, and taxes in Ireland in lieu of some rates, duties, and taxes, bounties, and drawbacks.
