RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, cap. 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of forty days from 9th October, to make alterations, as shown below, in the Regulations for the Admission of Candidates to the Civil Service of India under section 32 of the Statute 21 and 22 Victoria, cap. 106.

For that part of Regulation 4 which refers to Natural Science, and which at present stands as follows:—
