Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Acts, 1828 to 1868.

THE DISTRICT OF THE RIVER FORTH
(ANNUAL CLOSE TIME) ORDER, 1900.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me, and
upon application by Petition from the
District Board of the River Forth, in terms of
section 9 of the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act,
1868, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh,
Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secre-

tary for Scotland, do hereby make the following
Order:—

1. The Annual Close Time for the District of
the River Forth shall commence on the
27th day of August, and terminate on
the 10th day of February, both days in-
clusive.
2. It shall be lawful to fish for and to take
salmon with the rod and line in the
district of the River Forth from the 15th
day of January to the 15th day of
October, both days inclusive.
3. This Order shall take effect on the first day
of January 1901.
4. This Order may be cited as the Salmon
Fisheries—District of the River Forth—
(Annual Close Time) Order, 1900.
5. The Bye-law applicable to the district of
the River Forth contained in Schedule C
of the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act,
1868, and the Order of the Secretary for
Scotland, dated 13th October 1887, appli-
cable to the said district, are hereby
revoked.
