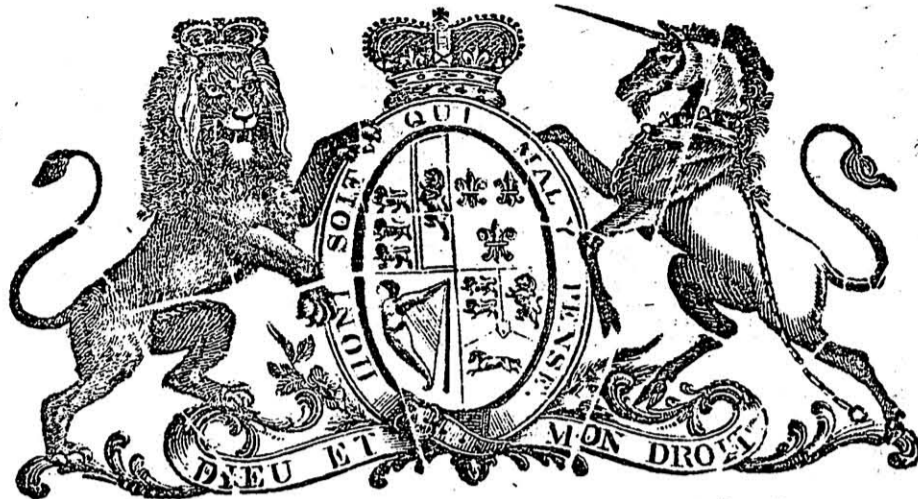

DISSOLUTION OF COPARTNERY.
