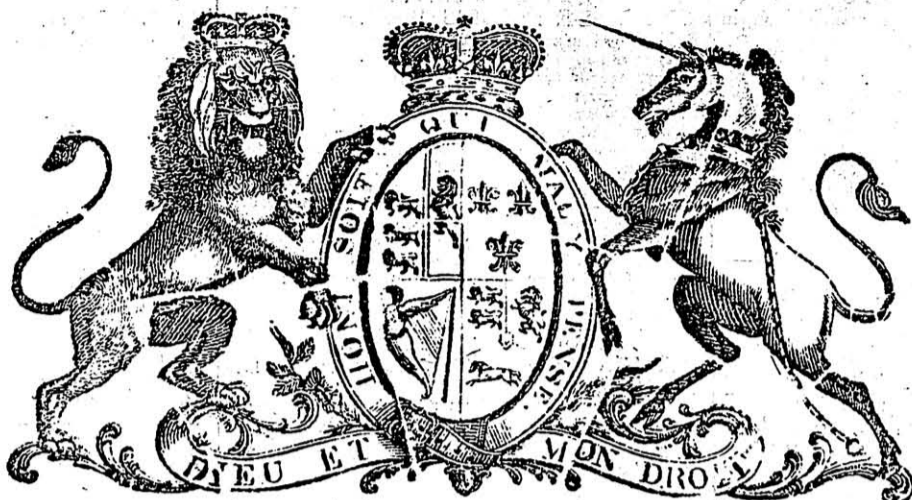

**By the KING.—A PROCLAMATION,
FOR A GENERAL FAST.**

GEORGE R.

We, taking into our most serious consideration the just and necessary war in which we are engaged, and putting our trust in Almighty God that he will graciously bless our arms, both by sea and land, have resolved, and do, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, hereby command, that a public day of fasting and humiliation be observed throughout that part of our kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the 7th day of June next ensuing, that so both we and our people may humble ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain pardon of our sins, and in the most devout and solemn manner, send up our prayers and supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy judgements which our manifold provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring his blessing and assistance on our arms, for the restoration of peace and prosperity to us and our dominions: And we do strictly charge and command, that the said public fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all our loving subjects in Scotland, as they tender the favour of Almighty God, and would avoid his wrath and indignation; and upon pain of such punishment as we may justly inflict on all such as contemn and neglect the performance of so religious and necessary a duty.

Given at our Court at the Queen's Palace, this 23d day of April 1804, in the 44th year of our reign.
