THE GREENWICH HOSPITAL ACT, 1865.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance

of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council approving a Memorial of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, recommending the award of allowances at the minimum rate of 1s. a week out of the funds of Greenwich Hospital to non-pensioners admitted into Hospitals or Infirmarys.
