TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 24th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vict. cap. 2, and 52 Vict. cap. 6, to the amount of £2,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 30th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 30th January 1902, and will be payable at twelve months after date, viz., on the 30th January 1903.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Saturday the 25th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock on Thursday the 30th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

POSTAL ORDERS.

NATAL AND ORANGE RIVER COLONY.

In pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, His Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that Regulations dated the 13th day of January 1902, have been made by him, with the consent of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848, 1880, and 1883, for the payment, subject to the provisions of the said Regulations, at any Post Office in the United Kingdom of Postal Orders issued at certain Post Offices in Natal and Orange River Colony to soldiers of His Majesty serving with the Colours in South Africa, and for the payment at such last-mentioned Post Offices, and also at Durban, to such persons of Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom.
