For the information of the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, I fend you herewith a letter recently received from Captain Roberts, of the Snake, commanding a finall force stationed at New Providence.

This moment has arrived his Majesty's sloop Lilly, Captain Lyall, from Bermuda, who has brought with him the Batavian Republic schooner Draak, commanded by a Lieutenant of Frigate, captured on the 1st instant. She mounts four four and one three-pounders, and fifty men; seven weeks, from Curacoa, and had taken nothing.
