## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of forty days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 9 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, defining what is sufficient and suitable sanitary accommodation within the meaning of that section.

## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice, in pursuance of section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the manufacture of felt hats with the aid of inflammable solvent to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make regulations for factories and workshops in which the manufacture is carried on.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained at the Office of the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London.

Objections to the draft Regulations by or on behalf of any person affected by the Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State within thirty days from the date of this Notice.
