A PROCLAMATION

For appointing a Day for the Celebration of the Solemnity of the Coronation of Their Majesties.

EDWARD, R. & I.

WHEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing date the 10th day of December last, We did (amongst other things) publish and declare Our Royal intention to celebrate the Solemnity of Our Royal Coronation and of the Coronation of Our dearly-beloved Consort the Queen upon Thursday, the 26th day of June, at Our Palace at Westminster; and whereas We were constrained to adjourn the said Solemnity to a day in August thereafter to be determined, We do now by this, Our Royal Proclamation, give notice that We have resolved, by the favour and blessing of Almighty God, to celebrate the said Solemnity upon Saturday, the 9th day of August next; and We do hereby strictly charge all Our loving subjects whom it may concern, that all persons of what rank or quality soever they be, who either upon Our Letters of Summons to them directed were charged to be present on the 26th day of June last, or by reason of their offices and tenures or otherwise were called to do any service at the time of Our Coronation, do duly give their attendance at the said Solemnity on Saturday, the 9th day of August, in all respects furnished and appointed as to so great a Solemnity appertaineth, and answerable to the dignities and places which every one of them respectively holdeth and enjoyeth, and of this they or any of them are not to fail, as they will answer the contrary at their perils, unless upon special reasons,

by Ourselves to be allowed, We shall dispense with any of their services or attendances.

Given at Our Court of Saint James', this twenty-sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two, and in the second year of Our Reign.

For appointing Saturday, August 9th, a Bank Holiday and a Public Holiday.

EDWARD, R. & I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Saturday, the 9th day of August next, being the occasion of the Solemnity of Our Royal Coronation, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," "The Bank Holidays Extension Act, 1875," "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," and "The Revenue Offices (Scotland) Holidays Act, 1880," Do hereby, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, appoint Saturday, the 9th day of August next, being the occasion of the said Solemnity of our Royal Coronation, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday throughout the United Kingdom.

and every part thereof, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.
