Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Rainier, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the East Indies, to the Secretary of the Admiralty, dated on board the Trident, in Bombay-Harbour, 24th January 1804.

The Albion and Sceptre captured the Clarisse French privateer, of 12 guns and 157 men, on the 21st of December, in lat. 1. 18. deg. S. and long. 95 deg. 20 min. E. The Clarisse sailed from the Isle of France the 24th November, victualled for six months, to cruise in the Bay of Bengal; she had not made any capture.
