Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Rainier, Commander in Chief of his Majefly's Ships and Vessels in the East Indies, to the Secretary of the Admiralty, dated on board the Trident, in Bom-Bay Harbour, 24th January 1804.

The Albion and Sceptre captured the Clariffe French privateer, of 12 guns and 157 men, on the 21th of December; in lat. 1. 18. deg. S. and long. 95 deg. 20 min. E. The Clariffe failed from the Isle of France the 24th November, victualled for fix months, to cruize in the Bay of Bengal; she had not made any-capture.
