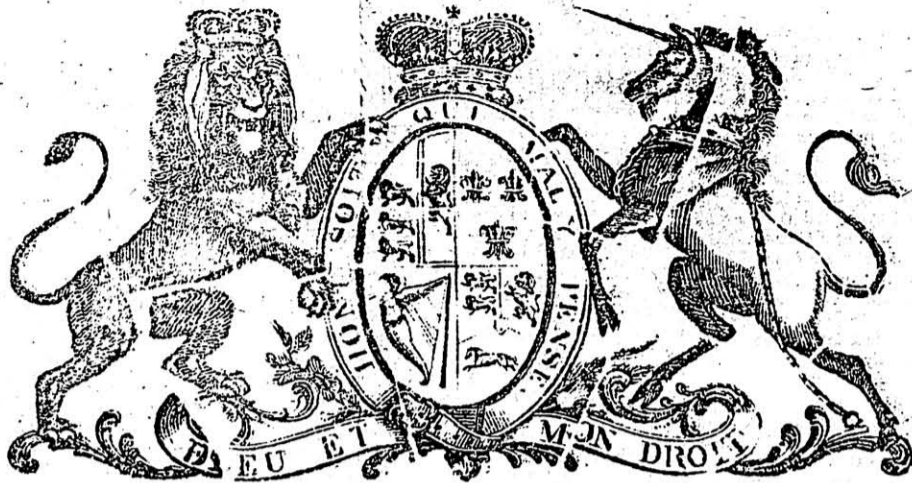

At the Court at the Queens' Palace, 27th June 1804.

**PRESENT:**  
The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.  
This day the Right Hon. William Drummond and the Right Hon. Charles Arbutnot, were, by his Majesty's command, sworn of his Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council; and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.  
The same day his Majesty in Council was pleased to order, that the colony of Surinam be placed under the same commercial regulations as the other West India colonies; and to permit the exportation of bar and pig iron to countries in amity with his Majesty.

**WESTMINSTER, JUNE 29.**

This day, the Lords being met, and the Commons attending, the Royal assent, by commission, was given to an act for establishing and maintaining a permanent additional force for the defence of the realm, and to provide for augmenting his Majesty's regular forces, and for the gradual reduction of the militia of England. An act for directing certain public accounts of Ireland to be laid annually before Parliament. An act to exempt from duties on export all linens of the manufacture of the United Kingdom. An act to indemnify solicitors, attorneys, &c. who have neglected to enter certificates, &c. An act for the preventing of bribery and corruption in the election of members to serve in Parliament for the Burgh of Aylesbury. An act for making further provision for making and maintaining an inland navigation, commonly called the Caledonian Canal, from the Eastern to the Western Sea, by Inverness and Fort William. An act to alter and amend several acts for making and repairing Turnpike Roads in the county of Haddington. An act to alter, amend, and consolidate several acts for making and repairing turnpike roads in the counties of Kent, Lanark, and Ayr. An act to suspend prosecutions under certain acts relative to the woollen manufacture; and to 51 English road and private acts.
