

disease for the purpose of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables or military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Interpretation.

9. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture;

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

10. This Order extends to the city of Aberdeen only.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of March one thousand nine hundred and three.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the ABERDEEN (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1903.
