The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. John Macintosh to superintend the transfer of lascars, or other persons, at Troon, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vict. cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for, is limited to three shillings. and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
