WESTMINSTER, JULY 3.

This day the Lords being met, and the Commons attending, the Royal Assent, by commission, was given to an act to continue, until the 1st July 1805, an act passed in the last session of Parliament, for continuing two acts, the one passed in the 42d year of his present Majesty, for regulating the prices at which grain, meal, and flour may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain; and the other, made in the last session of Parliament, for permitting the exportation of seed corn from Great Britain to Ireland, and the importation of malt into Great Britain from Ireland.—An act for assessing the proprietors of lands in the county of Inverness towards the expence of making and supporting such roads and bridges therein as shall be approved of by the Commissioners appointed by an act of the last session of Parliament, for making roads and building bridges in the islands of Scotland.

This Gazette contains an order for continuing the prohibition against exporting naval stores for six months from the 11th inst.
