LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S OFFICE,  
ST. JAMES' PALACE, June 16, 1903.

THE Lord Chamberlain is commanded by The King to announce that His Majesty will hold a Levée at Dublin Castle, on Wednesday, July 22nd, at 12 o'clock noon, and that Their Majesties will hold a Court on Thursday, July 23rd, at 10.30 P.M.

It may be necessary to limit the numbers of those who can be received on these occasions, but it is the wish of The King and Queen that opportunity of attending should be given, as far as possible, to those Irish Ladies and Gentlemen who have hitherto been unable to pay their respects at Courts and Levées in London.

The following regulations will be observed:—

#### LEVÉE.

Applications from Gentlemen wishing to be summoned should be addressed to the Lord Chamberlain at *Dublin Castle* as soon as possible, and not later than Friday, June 26th. These will be submitted, and summonses to a certain number will subsequently be issued.

Gentlemen who have not been previously presented should notify the fact in their applications.

All presentations, other than those of Naval and Military Officers, will be made by His Excellency The Lord Lieutenant.

Naval Officers and Officers of the Royal Marines on duty with the Fleet in Irish Waters will be presented by the Senior Naval Officer, and should send in their applications to Rear-Admiral E. F. Jeffreys, Queenstown.

Officers of the Army, Militia, and Volunteer Forces quartered in Ireland will be presented by, and should send in their applications to, His Royal Highness The General Officer Commanding in Ireland, Royal Hospital, Dublin.

Officers of the Royal Irish Constabulary wishing to attend should send in their names to the Inspector-General, who will submit a limited number.

Members of the Civil Service should apply through the Heads of their respective Departments.

All Gentlemen will be named to His Majesty by the Lord Chamberlain.

There will be no Private Entrée.

Levée Dress will be worn.

#### COURT.

The Court will be held in Saint Patrick's Hall.

Ladies desirous of attending are requested to address their applications to the Lord Chamberlain at *Dublin Castle* as soon as possible, and not later than Friday, June 26th. These will be submitted, and summonses to a certain number will subsequently be issued.

Ladies who have not been previously presented should notify the fact in their applications.

Gentlemen are not expected to attend the Court except when accompanying ladies of their family, in which case they will pass the Presence in a line parallel to that of the ladies.

The names of Gentlemen wishing to accompany Ladies must be included in the same application.

Ladies and Gentlemen who have been presented at any time in London, will not pass the Presence, but will assemble in Saint Patrick's

Hall before the arrival of Their Majesties and remain till the end of the Court.

All the Ladies who pass the Presence will be presented by Her Excellency the Countess of Dudley (being named by the Lord Chamberlain).

There will be no Private Entrée.

Ladies—Court Dress with Trains, white feathers and lappets.

Gentlemen—Full Dress.

\* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
