A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD, R. & I.

**W**HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Monday the second day of November one thousand nine hundred and three; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Friday the eleventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and three.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this ninth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, and in the third year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 9th day of October 1903.
