The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Hon. William Pitt, George Percy, Esq. (commonly called Lord Lovaine), James Edward Harris, Esq. (commonly called Viscount Fitz-Harris), the Right Hon. Charles Long, and George Spencer, Esq. (commonly called Marquis of Blandford), to be Commissioners for executing the office of Treasurer of his Majesty's Exchequer.
