TREASURY BILLS.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that, under the powers conferred by the Act 40 Vict. c. 2, s. 9, they have amended the regulation laid down in the Treasury Minute of the thirty-first May 1889, relating to Tenders for Treasury Bills, by pre-scribing that the notice of the reception of such tenders at the office of the Chief Cashier at the Bank of England on a given day shall be published in the London Gazette not less than three (instead of five) clear days before the date on which tenders are to be delivered.
