SIR-Herewith I transmit for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter from Captain Innes, of his Majefly's floop Rambler, giving an account of the capture of two floops of the enemy, and of having driven on fhore the rest of a coasting convoy at St Gillies.—I am, &c...

His Majesty's Sloop Rambler, at Sea,
August 16. 1804.

Sire—I have the honour to acquaint you, that,
being between the Isle Dieu and the main on
the morning of the 7th instant, I observed nine
sail of sloops and chasse marces close in shore,
sheering to the southward and eastward. About
nine it fell calm; I then sent the boats, under
the command of Lieutenant Foreman and Mr
Cox, master's mate, to take possession of them;
but, favoured by a light air, they came to an anchor under the battery of St Gillies, and within
musiket-shot of the shore; notwithstanding which,
two of the sloops were brought off with great
gallantry under a smart fire from field pieces and
