The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Walter William Adrian MacGeough Bond, Esq., Vice-President of the Egyptian Native Court of Appeal, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Second Class of the Imperial Ottoman Order of the Medjidieh and the Insignia of the Third Class of the Imperial Ottoman Order of the Osmanieh, which Decorations have been conferred upon him by His Highness the Khedive of Egypt, authorised by His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him to His Highness.
