LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACTS.  
 COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTORAL DIVISIONS OF THE COUNTY OF BANFF  
 (Nos. 2 AND 15).

WHEREAS by their Order, dated 28th September 1891, the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland determined the Contents and Boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of the County of Banff:

And whereas the boundaries of the Police Burgh of Buckie were extended under the provisions of the Buckie Burgh Extension and Buckie (Craigenroan) Harbour Provisional Order Confirmation Act, 1902:

And whereas, in view of the foregoing change of circumstances, the County Council of Banff have applied to me for an Order, in terms of section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, providing for a readjustment of the description of the contents and boundaries of the second and fifteenth of the aforesaid Electoral Divisions:

And whereas I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the application of the said County Council:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Andrew Graham Murray, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby order as follows:—

The Order of the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland, dated 28th September 1891, dealing with the Electoral Divisions of the County of

Banff, is hereby recalled, in so far as the Divisions of Portnockie and Buckie East are concerned, and from and after this date there shall be constituted in lieu thereof County Council Electoral Divisions having the following names and contents—that is to say:—

PORTNOCKIE.—That part of the Parish of Rathven which lies to the east of the Police Burgh of Buckie, as extended by the provisions of the Buckie Burgh Extension and Buckie (Craigenroan) Harbour Provisional Order Confirmation Act, 1902, and to the north of the centre of the Great North of Scotland Railway line from Elgin to Cullen.

BUCKIE EAST.—That part of the Police Burgh of Buckie, as extended by the provisions of the Buckie Burgh Extension and Buckie (Craigenroan) Harbour Provisional Order Confirmation Act, 1902, which lies to the east of the Buru of Buckie.
