LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACTS.

County Council Electoral Divisions of the County of Lanark, within the Police Burgh of Partick.

THEREAS the Contents and Boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of the County of Lanark were determined by an Order under the hand and seal of the Secretary for Scotland, dated 16th May 1899.

And whereas the Contents and Boundaries of the said Electoral Divisions so far as within the Police Burgh of Partick were, under the Order of 16th May 1899, made coincident with the then existing Municipal Wards of the said Police Burgh; and whereas by Deliverance of the Sheriff of the County of Lanark, dated 17th May 1902, the Municipal Wards of the said Police Burgh were increased in number from five to six, and altered in description, so that as now constituted they do not coincide with the County Council Electoral Divisions as determined under the said Order of 16th May 1899.

And whereas, in view of the aforesaid change of circumstances, the County Council of Lanark have applied to me for an Order, in terms of Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, providing for a readjustment of the description of the Contents and Boundaries of the aforesaid Electoral Divisions.

And whereas I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the application of the said County Council, subject to certain modifications.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Andrew Graham Murray, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the said Acts, do hereby order and determine that the Contents and Boundaries of the Electoral Divisions within the Police Burgh of Partick shall be as follows:—

Partick East.—The new First Municipal Ward of the Police Burgh of Partick.

Partick East Central.—The new Second Municipal Ward of the Police Burgh of Partick.

Partick Central.—The new Third Municipal Ward of the Police Burgh of Partick.

Partick West.—The new Fourth and Fifth Municipal Wards of the Police Burgh of Partick.

Whiteinch.—The new Sixth Municipal Ward of the Police Burgh of Partick.
