MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulation under Section 9.

**THE MOTOR CARS (RESTRICTION OF SPEED)
(BURGH OF TOBERMORY) ORDER, 1904.**

WHEREAS by section 9, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Secretary for Scotland, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles an hour :

And whereas the Town Council of the Burgh of Tobermory have applied to me to make a Regulation under the said section for the safety of the public within the said area, and I am of opinion that it is desirable to grant the said application :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, the undersigned, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Regulation :—

1. No person shall drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles an hour on the roads or portions of roads within the Burgh of Tobermory, specified in the Schedule to this Regulation.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars (Restriction of Speed) (Burgh of Tobermory) Order, 1904."

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
