- “(6) To enter into any contract with any person or persons, corporation or corporations, or any association to regulate the course of business, for the purpose of establishing any tariff of prices or otherwise, and to contribute out of the Company's funds to any association of employers for protection against, or for lessening, or apportioning, or sharing loss consequent upon strikes or combinations of workmen.
- “(7) To sell the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company may think fit; and in particular for shares, debentures, or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.
- “(8) To promote any Company or Companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the property, rights, and liabilities of this Company, or for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly calculated to benefit this Company.
- “(9) To purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any part of the business, property, and liabilities of any person or Company carrying on any business which this Company is authorised to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the Company.
- “(10) To amalgamate with any other Company or Firm carrying on business of a like or a similar nature whether by sale or purchase of the undertaking, subject to the liabilities of this or any such other Company as aforesaid, with or without winding up, or by sale or purchase of all the shares or stock of this or any such other Company as aforesaid; and in all cases the price or consideration payable to or by this Company may be paid or accepted in Shares, Debentures, Debenture Stock, Mortgage Debentures, or other Securities, either fully or partly paid, as may be found expedient.
- “(11) To lend money to such persons and on such terms as may seem expedient, and in particular to customers of and persons having dealings with the Company, and to guarantee the performance of contracts by members of or persons having dealings with the Company.
- “(12) To borrow or raise any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company by the issue, either without security or upon the security of or upon Bonds or Debentures or Debenture Stocks, or Mortgage Debentures, Bonds of Cash-Credit, or other obligations or securities of the Company, and at a discount or otherwise, and repayable in such manner as may be deemed expedient.
- “(13) To take or otherwise acquire and hold shares in any other Limited Company, whether having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company or not, carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company.
