A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD, R. & I.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the third day of November one thousand nine hundred and four; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday the twentieth day of December one thousand nine hundred and four.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four, and in the fourth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 24th October 1904 he made Regulations under section 79 of the said Act, to come into force on the 1st January 1905, in respect of the processes of loading, unloading, moving, and handling goods in, on, or at any Dock, Wharf, or Quay; and the processes of loading, unloading, or coaling any ship in any Dock, Harbour, or Canal.
