MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF HADDINGTON.

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the County of Haddington have made application to the Secretary for Scotland praying that Regulations under the Motor Car Act should be made—

- 1st. Prohibiting motor car traffic on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Schedules appended to the application.
- 2nd. Restricting the maximum rate of speed of motor car traffic to ten miles an hour on the highways or portions of highways, and in the Burghs, Villages, and populous places specified in the Schedules appended to the application.

Notice is hereby further given that the application, with relative Schedules and map on scale one

inch to the mile showing the roads proposed for prohibition and restriction, and the points where prohibition and restriction begins and ends, may be inspected during office hours at the Office of the County Clerk, Haddington, and that objections to the making of any such Regulations may be sent in writing to the Secretary for Scotland at the Scottish Office, Whitehall, London, at any time within fourteen days of the date of publication of this advertisement. A copy of any such objections should be sent at the same time to the County Clerk.
