Dispatches have been received from Commodore Hood, commanding his Majesty's ships and vessels in the Leeward Islands, containing a list of 33 vessels captured and recaptured by his Squadron, between the 1st of January and 30th of June 1804. Among the captures are, the Egyptienne privateer (formerly frigate) of 36 guns and 250 men; the Curieux-corvette, of 16 guns and 105 men; the Prosperine Dutch frigate of 32 guns, Pylades corvette of 18 guns, and George schooner of 10 guns, and nine French privateers, of from one to 12 guns, and 30 to 80 men.
