FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 18th February 1905, he made an Order, under section 54, sub-section (4), of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, permitting (subject to conditions) the employment at night of male young persons of the age of sixteen years and upwards in the process of continuous wire drawing.
