At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th day of February 1905.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation stating that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor by the Sheriff-Substitute at Elgin, finding that the Burial Ground of the Parish of Drainie at Kinnead, in the County of Elgin, is in a condition which is dangerous to health and offensive and contrary to decency, and that it is expedient that the same should be closed for sepulture, except for the burial of (first) any person, widow or widower, whose husband or wife has been buried in said Burial Ground; (second) persons, children of whom are, at the date of closing said Burial Ground, buried there; and (third) the unmarried children of parents who are at that date buried in the said Burial Ground; provided always that the exercise of the rights of burial above-mentioned shall not be offensive, injurious, or dangerous to public health, and that proper and sufficient ground is available in the respective family burial places, and that the same be carried out to the satisfaction of the Clerk of the Parish Council of the said Parish of Drainie:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that the said Burial Ground should be closed, subject to the conditions named, and subject to the further conditions as regards all interments after the date of the Order in Council directing the closing of the said Burial Ground, that no interment shall be made unless the coffin

can be laid at a depth of four feet from the surface of the ground to the upper side of the coffin, and that without the exposure of another coffin, and that notice be given to the Clerk of the Parish Council of Drainie on the day preceding that on which a grave is to be opened:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the 17th day of April next:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order, or notice thereof, be affixed, as required by the above-mentioned Act, on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before such Representation is so considered.
