WHITEHALL, March 4, 1905.

The King has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, granting unto His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, K.G., the Office of Constable of His Majesty's Castle of Dover, and also the Office of Warden and Keeper of His Majesty's Cinque Ports, and the Office of Admiralty within the said Cinque Ports, in the room of George Nathaniel, Baron Curzon of Kedleston, G.M.S.I., G.M.I.E., Viceroy of India, resigned.

The King has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 6th instant, to appoint James Craufurd Dunlop, Esq., M.D., F.R.C.P.
