ORDER BY THE SECRETARY FOR SCOTLAND.

I, the Right Honourable John Adrian Louis, Marquis of Linlithgow, K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, upon consideration of a Petition dated 15th February 1905, of the Town Council of the Royal Burgh of Pittenweem under section 7 of the Town Councils (Scotland) Act, 1903, and after advertisement thereof, hereby determine, in terms of the said section, that the Retiral and Election of Councillors in the said Royal Burgh of Pittenweem shall, in the year 1905 and annually thereafter, take place upon the second Tuesday of December, instead of the first Tuesday of November, and that the dates specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto annexed shall be consequently altered as shown in the third column of the said Schedule. In the year 1907 and in any succeeding year, in which the election of a County Council is appointed to take place, the existing County Councillor elected to represent the said Burgh on the County Council of Fife in terms of section 8 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1889, shall continue in office until his successor is appointed at the time prescribed in the said Schedule.
