FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publications Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of forty days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under sections 107, 108, and 110 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, applying the provisions of sections 107 (relating to lists of outworkers), section 108 (relating to employment in unwholesome premises), and section 110 (relating to the prohibition of home-work in places where there is infectious disease) to the following classes of work in addition to those specified in the Home Work Orders of 11th December 1901 and 14th July 1902, viz.:—

The making of covers for, and the covering, finishing, altering, or repairing of, umbrellas, sunshades, parasols, and articles of a similar character, and any work incidental thereto;

The making of paper bags and of paper boxes; Brushmaking; and

The making of stuffed dolls.

^{*} Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
