Greeting!

Whereas under the Churches (Scotland) Act, 1905, a Commission is established for the alloca-

tion of property between the Free Church and the United Free Church in Scotland:

And whereas it is provided that the Commission under the said Act shall consist of five Commissioners to be appointed by Us.

Now know ye that We, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us by the said recited Act, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge, discretion, and ability, have nominated, constituted, and appointed, and do by these presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you, the said Victor Alexander, Earl of Elgin and Kincardine (Chairman); Alexander Smith, Baron Kinnear; Sir Thomas David Gibson-Carmichael, Sir Ralph William Anstruther, and Sir Charles Bowman Logan to be Commissioners for the purpose of carrying into effect the Churches (Scotland) Act, 1905.

Given at Our Court at St. James', the 11th day of August 1905, in the fifth year of Our Reign.
