NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary for Scotland has confirmed the following Bye-Law passed by the Fishery Board for Scotland, viz. :—

BYE-LAW (No. 20) altering Bye-Law No. 17, made by the Fishery Board for Scotland under the powers conferred on the Board by the Sea Fisheries (Scotland) Amendment Act, 1885.

1. Notwithstanding Bye-Law No. 17, made by the Fishery Board for Scotland on the 21st October

1898, and confirmed by the Secretary for Scotland on 7th December 1898, it shall be lawful to use a seine net, or a flounder net with a bag, in the capture of white fish during September, October, November, and December of each year, in the waters lying within three miles of low water mark inside a straight line drawn from Corsewall Point, in the County of Wigton, to the Mull of Cantyre, in the County of Argyll, and during August, September, October, and November of each year, in the waters lying within three miles of low water mark between a straight line drawn due north from Preston Links Colliery building and a straight line drawn north-west from Gullane Ness, in the County of Haddington, respectively, provided (1) that, in the working of the net, only one boat shall be employed; (2) that the net shall be hauled in as soon as its ends have been brought together and shall not otherwise be dragged or trailed along the bottom of the sea; (3) that the size of each mesh of the net so employed, and of any bag attached thereto, shall be such that a square gauge of $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches measured across each side of the square or 10 inches measured round the four sides, will pass without pressure when the net is wet; (4) that the boat from which the net is used shall not exceed 30 feet of keel and shall be propelled by means of sails or oars and not by any mechanical power; and (5) that no otter boards shall be used.

2. Except in so far as it is altered by this Bye-Law, Bye-Law No. 17 shall remain in force.

3. This Bye-Law shall come into force from and after the date of its confirmation by the Secretary for Scotland, and shall remain in force for five

years thereafter, unless it is sooner revoked or altered.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH SEPTEMBER 1905.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Sheep entered for exhibition or sale at either of the Shows specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be exempt from the provisions of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland) Order of 1905, but such sheep shall not be moved out of the Dipping Area to which such Order relates, unless accompanied by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which they are so moved, which Licence shall only be granted upon production of a veterinary certificate showing freedom from disease or a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose to the effect that the sheep have been dipped since the eighteenth day of June nineteen hundred and five.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries have hereunto set their Official Seal this eleventh day of September nineteen hundred and five.
