THE King has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 9th instant, to appoint Edward Theodore Salvesen, Esq., K.C., Solicitor-General for Scotland, to be one of the Senators of the College of Justice in Scotland, in the room of the Honourable Lord Kincairney, resigned.

Order under Section 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879.

Fees payable in the Office of Land Revenue Records and Involments.

Whereas by section 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, it is provided that the Treasury may from time to time make, and, when made, revoke, alter, and add to, regulations for all or any of the following purposes respecting Fees in any Public Office, that is to say:—

- 1. Regulating the manner in which the Fees taken in money are to be accounted for and paid over.
- 2. Determining the issue of Impressed or Adhesive Stamps and the mode of cancellation of Adhesive Stamps.
- 3. Regulating the use of stamps and prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use and requiring documents to be used for the purpose of such stamps.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the of March 1903, Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, Fees Act, 1879.

do, in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, section 3, hereby give notice, order and direct that stamps used for denoting Fees taken in the Land Revenue Record Office shall be of the character and be applied and otherwise dealt with in the manner prescribed in the Schedule hereto, all previous Orders on the subject being hereby cancelled.

The Adhesive Stamps referred to in the Schedule hereto shall be overprinted with the words "Public Records (L.R.R. & I.)." The stamps shall all be cancelled by a hand stamp containing the word "cancelled," and the date or otherwise as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may from time to time direct.

And we do further direct that this Order shall be binding on all Officers and persons whom it may in any way affect.

In all cases where the Fees to be taken are not specified by some Act of Parliament, the following fees shall be taken in the Office of Land Revenue Records and Involments, such fees being payable by means of stamps in accordance with the notice published in the London Gazette of the 20th day of March 1903, in pursuance of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879.

Character of Stamps to be used.

- I. For the enrolment of a document by entry, five shillings, with a further charge of sixpence for each folio of 72 words beyond the tenth folio ...
- II. For the enrolment of a Memorial of a Deed, pursuant to the Copyhold Act, 1894, five shillings
- III. For a certified Copy of any document or of an extract from any document, sixpence for each folio of 72 words
- IV. For making and examining a copy of a plan or of an extract from a plan, two shillings and sixpence for every hour occupied thereon ...
- V. For the inspection of one document, one shilling Adhesive.
- VI. For the inspection of several documents belonging to one series, produced on one and the same day, two shillings and sixpence ...

^{*} Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
