Copy of a letter from Vice Admiral Sir John Thomas Duckworth, K. B. Commander in Chief of his Majefty's ships and vessels at Jamaica, to WILLIAM MARS-DEN, Efq. dated at Port Royal, the 24th of July 1804.

I herewith transmit you a letter from Lieute-nant Price, commanding his Majesty's schooner Flying Fish, for the information of the Lords

His Majesty's schooner Flying Fish, Montego Bay, July 16. 1804. SIR.

I beg leave to inform you, that, on the 14th instant, I fell in with and recaptured the British schooner Content, which had been captured the evening before by the French privateer La Republic, off Black River.

From the prisoners I gained information about her, and shaped the most likely course to meet her next morning: After a chace of five hours I captured her also. She had on board when they left St Jago fifty men, with musketry and one long gun, and had made three captures.
