A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD, R. & I.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the twelfth day of December one thousand nine hundred and five; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Monday the filteenth day of January one thousand nine hundred and six.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and five, and in the fifth year of Our Reign.
