MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

NOTICE is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council substituting for the provisions contained in Article 10 of the Regulations scheduled to the Order in Council of 11th August 1884, for preventing Collisions at Sea, as amended from time to time, certain other provisions as regards Lights and Signals of Fishing Vessels.

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body, within forty days of the date of this notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.
