ORDERS FOR THE MOURNING OF OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL NAVY AND ROYAL MARINES FOR HIS LATE MAJESTY, THE KING OF DENMARK.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have received His Majesty's commands to direct, on the present melancholy occasion of the death of His Majesty Christian IX., King of Denmark, K.G., G.C.B., Father of Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, that the Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines be required to wear, when in uniform, a band of black crape round the left arm as prescribed by the Regulations.

The mourning will commence from 1st February and will be continued until 7th February inclusive.
